

**ORDINANCE NO. 45-B
TO PROVIDE FOR GARBAGE COLLECTION
SERVICES; TO PROVIDE RATES FOR DIFFERENT
CATEGORIES OF CUSTOMERS; TO PROVIDE FOR
PENALTIES ON PAST DUE ACCOUNTS AND THE
TERMINATION OF SERVICE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

WHEREAS, It is deemed by the Mayor and Council of the City of Hampton that the City is in need of a comprehensive Ordinance setting forth the garbage collection services to be provided by the City; the charges to residential, commercial and industrial garbage customers; penalties for late payment of said charges; and enforcement of said charges and penalties; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Hampton deem it to be in the public interest to have said Ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, by and through the authority of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hampton, it is hereby ordained as follows:

ARTICLE I - DEFINITIONS.

1. "Garbage" shall be defined as solid waste produced by residential, commercial and industrial customers.

2. "Residential customer" is defined as a single family dwelling and in the case of multiple family dwellings, each such single dwelling located in the multiple family structure.

3. "Light commercial customers" shall be defined as people or businesses who provide professional service that generates a minimal amount of disposable waste, including, by way of example and not limitation, banks, insurance agencies, real estate agencies, beauticians, dentists, doctors and lawyers.

4. "Heavy commercial customers" shall be defined as people or businesses who provide retail or wholesale service for the distribution of goods and/or services, including, by way of example and not limitation, drug stores, service stations, restaurants, grocery stores, building supply businesses, auto repair shops, and auto parts businesses.

5. "Industrial customers" shall be defined as people or businesses who make or manufacture goods for resale and people or businesses who provide transportation for goods which are to be resold or distributed.

6. "Hazardous Substances" shall be defined as and include all hazardous and toxic substances, wastes or materials, any pollutants or contaminants as defined in Section 101(14) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. Section 9601(14), the Federal Water

Pollution Control Act, as amended, the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 ("RCRA"), as amended, the Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended, the Toxic Substances Control Act, as amended, the Hazardous & Solid Waste Amendments Act of 1984, as amended, the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, as amended, the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, as amended, and any other federal, state or local environmental conservation or protection laws (including, without limitation, asbestos containing materials, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB's), acetone methyl-ethyl-ketone (MEK), trichloroethylene (TCE), trichloroethane (TCA), perchloroethylene (PCE's), total organic halogen (TOX), total organic carbon (TOC), toluene, benzene, ethyl benzene, xylene, ethylene glycol, urea formaldehyde, lead, barium, copper, mercury, nickel, zinc, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, and total petroleum hydrocarbons, motor fuels, and all petroleum based products), or other similar substances, or materials which are included under or regulated by any local, state or federal law, rule or regulation pertaining to environmental regulation, contamination or clean-up, including, without limitation, those acts identified above.

ARTICLE II - SERVICE TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CITY OF HAMPTON.

1. The City of Hampton shall provide for one pick-up per week for customers.

2. Additional pick-ups shall be classified as more than stated within this article.

ARTICLE III - PICK-UP OF GARBAGE.

1. Residential customers shall place their garbage in containers to be located on the customer's property which are easily accessible by the pick-up personnel.

2. Light commercial customers, heavy commercial customers and industrial customers shall place their garbage in containers and provide storage areas for the garbage which shall be enclosed, but accessible to pick-up personnel.

3. All garbage shall be placed in bags of not more than thirty-gallon capacity, cartons or boxes of not more than thirty-gallon capacity, or tied in bundles not larger than two and one-half feet by two and one-half feet by three feet.

4. No liquid petroleum products, by-products or wastes; tires; large appliances; auto parts; furniture; pipe; plumbing or electrical fixtures; tree limbs; or hazardous substances shall be picked up.

ARTICLE IV - RATES.

1. The monthly rate for garbage services to residential customers shall be \$7.00 per month.

2. The monthly rate for garbage services to light commercial customers shall be \$9.80 per month.

3. The monthly rate for garbage services to commercial customers shall be \$13.30 per month. This rate includes one additional pick-up per week.

4. The monthly rate for garbage services to heavy commercial customers shall be \$21.00 per month. Commercial customers who receive one additional pick-up per week shall be charged a rate of \$26.60 per month. Commercial customers who receive two additional pick-ups per week shall be charged a rate of \$32.20 per month.

5. The monthly rate for garbage services to industrial customers shall be \$35.00 per month. Industrial customers who receive one additional pick-up per week shall be charged a rate of \$40.60 per month.

ARTICLE V - COLLECTION OF GARBAGE FEES.

A. The charges to be made for services rendered under this Ordinance shall be made against owners, occupants, tenants or lessees of buildings or premises receiving the garbage service by the City of Hampton. Where an owner of property located in the City of Hampton, Georgia, to which garbage services are furnished, leases his property to another, the owner shall remain liable for the payment of the garbage services furnished to his tenant, and it shall be the owner's responsibility to see that all bills incurred by his tenant for garbage services are paid.

B. Should any person, owner, occupant, tenant or lessee of residential buildings and premises or of offices or businesses and commercial buildings and premises fail or refuse to pay the charges fixed against said owners, occupants, tenants and lessees as provided for in this ordinance when due, the Mayor and Council of the City of Hampton shall be privileged to discontinue garbage services to said residential, office or commercial or business premises until such fees have been paid in full.

C. Bills to customers for garbage collection services shall be mailed out on such day or days of the month as may be determined as desirable by the City. Bills shall be paid at the City Hall, and a failure to receive bills or notices shall not prevent such bills from becoming delinquent nor relieve any person responsible therefor from payment of same.

D. The failure of garbage collection customers to pay charges when due shall result in the automatic imposition of a penalty of \$3.00.

E. The Mayor shall be empowered to terminate garbage collection services for failure of customers and property owners of the City to pay their garbage collection bills. The Mayor, prior to the termination of garbage collection service for non-payment of

bills, shall direct the City Clerk to issue the following notice to the customer and/or property owner:

Dear Customer: Your garbage collection bills for the month(s) of _____ have not been paid. Your present amount due the City for garbage collection service is \$_____. Delinquent payment penalties have been assessed in the amount of \$_____. If your bill is in error, or if you have a legitimate complaint to file with the City concerning your bill, you must appear before the City Clerk on _____ at _____ o'clock ____m. to discuss any discrepancies that might exist. Failure to appear before the Clerk will result in the termination of garbage collection service to you on _____.

If the customer and/or property owner fails to pay the bill and penalties prior to the hearing, and/or the customer and/or property owner fails to appear for the hearing set forth in the notice, the Mayor shall be authorized to terminate garbage collection service on the date specified in the notice.

F. In addition thereto, if enforcement of payment is necessary, the cost of such enforcement shall be at the expense of the firm, corporation, owner or lessee liable for the payment of said garbage services, and collection may be made by process or procedure of law now available or which may hereafter be available, expressly including the right to cause a writ of fieri facias (fi. fa.) to be issued, levied and collected.

ARTICLE VI - CONSTITUTIONALITY.

In the event any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall in no manner affect the other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases of this Ordinance which shall remain of full force and effect as if the section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part hereof.

VII - REPEALER.

Any Ordinance in conflict herewith is hereby specifically repealed, specifically including, but not limited to, Ordinance No. 25, Ordinance No. 45 and Ordinance No. 45(a), and any amendments thereto.

ARTICLE VIII - EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall become effective on January 1, 1997.

ORDINANCE NO. 45-C

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 70 OF CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HAMPTON, GEORGIA, WHICH PROVIDES FOR SOLID WASTE; TO AMEND ARTICLE II ENTITLED "COLLECTION"; TO PROVIDE FOR CODIFICATION; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABILITY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAMPTON, GEORGIA, HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Code Section Amended. Article II of Chapter 70 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Hampton, Georgia, entitled "Collection" is hereby amended by deleting said Article in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof a new Article II also entitled "Collection" which shall read as follows:

Sec. 70-31. Definitions.

Garbage shall be defined as solid waste produced by residential, commercial and industrial customers.

Heavy commercial customers shall be defined as people or businesses who provide retail or wholesale service for the distribution of goods and/or services, including, by way of example and not limitation, drug stores, service stations, restaurants, grocery stores, building supply businesses, auto repair shops, and auto parts businesses.

Industrial customers shall be defined as people or businesses who make or manufacture goods for resale and people or businesses who provide transportation for goods which are to be resold or distributed.

Hazardous Substances shall be defined as and include all hazardous and toxic substances, wastes or materials, any pollutants or contaminants as defined in Section 101(14) of the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended, the Clean Water Act, as amended, the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, as amended, the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 ("RCRA"), as amended, the Safe Drinking Water Act, as amended, the Toxic Substances Control Act, as amended, the Hazardous & Solid Waste Amendments Act of

1984, as amended, the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act of 1986, as amended, the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act, as amended, and any other federal, state or local environmental conservation or protection laws (including, without limitation, asbestos containing materials, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB's), acetone methyl-ethyl-ketone (MEK), trichloroethylene (TCE), trichloroethane (TCA), perchloroethylene (PCE's), total organic halogen (TOX), total organic carbon (TOC), toluene, benzene, ethyl benzene, xylene, ethylene glycol, urea formaldehyde, lead, barium, copper, mercury, nickel, zinc, beryllium, cadmium, chromium, and total petroleum hydrocarbons, motor fuels, and all petroleum based products), or other similar substances, or materials which are included under or regulated by any local, state or federal law, rule or regulation pertaining to environmental regulation, contamination or clean-up, including, without limitation, those acts identified above.

Light commercial customers shall be defined as people or businesses who provide professional service that generate a minimal amount of disposable waste, including, by way of example and not limitation, banks, insurance agencies, real estate agencies, beauticians, dentists, doctors and lawyers.

Residential customer is defined as a single family dwelling, and in the case of multiple family dwellings, each such single dwelling located in the multiple family structure.

Sec. 70-32. Service to be provided by the City of Hampton.

(a) In order to protect the public health and sanitation, to prevent the spread of contagious or infectious diseases, and to prevent the breeding of rodents, insects and other vermin, all residential customers within the City shall receive regular garbage collection from the City. All residential customers will be entitled to one collection per week; however, due to unforeseen circumstances, this schedule may be altered. No owner of a residential property shall be exempt or relieved from payment of the monthly garbage collection fee by reason of failure or refusal to receive garbage collection services from the City.

(b) Heavy commercial, light commercial, and industrial customers will be entitled to one collection per week; however, due to unforeseen circumstances, this schedule may be altered. Heavy commercial, light commercial, and industrial customers who do not use the City's garbage pick-up shall establish another

Light commercial customers shall be defined as people or businesses who provide professional service that generate a minimal amount of disposable waste, including, by way of example, and not limitation, banks, insurance agencies, real estate agencies, dentists, doctors and lawyers.

Residential customer is defined as a single family dwelling, and in the case of multiple family dwellings, each such single dwelling located in the multiple family structure.

Sec. 70-32. Service to be provided by the City of Hampton.

(a) In order to protect the public health and sanitation, to prevent the spread of contagious or infectious diseases, and to prevent the breeding of rodents, insects and other vermin, all residential customers within the City shall receive regular garbage collection from the City. All residential customers will be entitled to one collection per week; however, due to unforeseen circumstances, this schedule may be altered. No owner of a residential property shall be exempt or relieved from payment of the monthly garbage collection fee by reason of failure or refusal to receive garbage collection services from the City.

(b) Heavy commercial, light commercial, and industrial customers will be entitled to one collection per week; however, due to unforeseen circumstances, this schedule may be altered. Heavy commercial, light commercial, and industrial customers who do not use the City's garbage pick-up shall establish their own

acceptable means for garbage disposal which may including contracting with private entities for garbage collection.

Sec. 70-33. Pick-up of garbage.

(a) By 6:30 a.m. on the scheduled day for collection, customers should place their container at curbside in front of the customer's residence. In no circumstance shall customers place their container at curbside sooner than 24 hours prior to their scheduled pick-up. Containers should be placed approximately four feet from the edge of the roadway, but not so as to pose a physical or visual obstruction to motorists or passersby. Containers shall not be placed in such a way as to block streets, sidewalks, driveways, or mailboxes. Where there is insufficient right-of-way adjacent to the roadway, or other topographical difficulties exist which make it unreasonable to conform to the general requirements, customers should place their container at a location mutually agreeable to the customer and the City, after consultation with the City Manager or his designee. All containers shall be removed from the curbside and returned to a location behind the customer's residence no later than 24 hours after collection. Due to holidays or other unforeseen circumstances, special collection services will be announced or published through the local news media.

(b) Residential customers shall place their garbage in containers provided by the City with lids tightly affixed and located on the customer's property and easily accessible by collection personnel. Each residential customer shall be provided one container by the City. Additional containers may be obtained from the City for a fee as established by the City from time to time.

(c) Light commercial customers, heavy commercial customers and industrial customers shall place their garbage in approved containers and provide storage areas for the garbage which shall be enclosed, but accessible to collection personnel.

(d) No liquid petroleum products, by-products or wastes; tires; large appliances; auto parts; paints, oils and chemicals; furniture; pipe; plumbing or electrical fixtures; tree limbs; or hazardous substances shall be picked up.

Sec. 70-33. Pick-up of garbage.

(a) By 8:30 a.m. on the scheduled day for collection, customers should place their container at curbside in front of the customer's residence. In no circumstance shall customers place their container at curbside sooner than 24 hours prior to their scheduled pick-up. Containers should be placed approximately four feet from the edge of the roadway, but not so as to pose a physical or visual obstruction to motorists or passersby. Containers shall not be placed in such a way as to block streets, sidewalks, driveways, or mailboxes. Where there are insufficient right-of-way adjacent to the roadway, or other topographical difficulties exist which make it unreasonable to conform to the general requirements, customers should place their container at a location mutually agreeable to the customer and the City, after consultation with the City Manager or his designee. All containers shall be removed from the curbside and returned to a location behind the customer's residence no later than 24 hours after collection. Due to holidays or other unforeseen circumstances, special collection services will be announced or published through the local news media.

(c) Liquid commercial customers, heavy commercial customers and industrial customers shall place their garbage in approved containers and provide storage areas for the garbage which shall be enclosed, but accessible to collection personnel.

(d) No liquid petroleum products, by-products or wastes; tires; large appliances; auto parts; paints, oils and chemicals; furniture; pipe; plumbing or electrical fixtures; tree limbs; or hazardous substances shall be picked up.

Sec. 70-34. Rates.

Rates for each category of customer shall be as established from time to time by the City Council and as shown of the City's schedule of fees and charges on file in the office of the City Clerk.

Sec. 70-35. Collection of garbage fees.

(a) Should any customer fail or refuse to pay the charges as provided for in this ordinance when due, the City Manager shall be privileged to discontinue garbage services to said customer until such fees have been paid in full.

(b) Bills to customers for garbage collection services shall be mailed out on such day or days of the month as determined by the City. Bills shall be paid at City Hall, and a failure to receive bills or notices shall not prevent such bills from becoming delinquent nor relieve any person responsible therefor from payment of same.

(c) The failure of garbage collection customers to pay charges when due shall result in the automatic imposition of a penalty in an amount as set from time to time by the City Council and as shown on the City's schedule of fees and charges on file in the office of he City Clerk.

(d) The City Manger shall be empowered to terminate garbage collection services for failure of customers and property owners of the City to pay their garbage collection bills or otherwise fail to follow the provisions of this Article. The City Manager, prior to the termination of garbage collection service for non-payment of bills, shall direct the City Clerk to issue the following notice to the customer and/or property owner:

Dear Customer: Your garbage collection bill(s) for the month(s) of _____ has/have not been paid. Your present amount due the City for garbage collection service is \$_____. Delinquent payment penalties have been assessed in the amount of \$_____. If your bill is in error, or if you have a legitimate complaint to file with the City concerning your bill, you must appear before the City Clerk on _____ at _____ o'clock _____.m. to discuss any discrepancies that might exist. Failure to appear before the Clerk will result in the termination of garbage collection service to you on _____.

If the customer and/or property owner fails to pay the bill and penalties prior to the hearing, and/or the customer and/or property owner fails to appear for the hearing set forth in the notice, the City Manager shall be authorized to terminate garbage collection service on the date specified in the notice.

(e) The fees specified in this Article, and any other charges, fees, or assessments imposed by the City for its garbage services, are levied against both the owner and occupant of the premises served, jointly and severally, but collection from one shall relieve the other. All uncollected fees due the City shall constitute a continuing lien against the property served to the same extent, and subject to the same addition of interest and costs, as provided by law with respect to ad valorem taxes, and may be enforced and collected in the same manner provided for the collection of delinquent taxes, including, but not limited to, the filing of record of a fi. fa. against the property in the Henry County Superior Court Clerk's Office.

(f) It shall be the duty of the Henry County Tax Commissioner to collect the amount of the lien imposed under Subsection (a) as if it were a real property ad valorem tax, using all methods available for collecting real property ad valorem tax, including specifically Chapter 4 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.); provided, however, that the limitation of O.C.G.A. § 48-4-78 which requires twelve (12) months of delinquency before commencing a tax foreclosure shall not apply.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

SECTION 3.

(A) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

(B) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council

If the customer and/or property owner fails to pay the bill and penalties prior to the hearing, and/or the customer and/or property owner fails to appear for the hearing set forth in the notice, the City Manager shall be authorized to terminate garbage collection service on the date specified in the notice.

(e) The fees specified in this Article, and any other charges, fees, or assessments imposed by the City for its garbage services, are levied against both the owner and occupant of the premises served, jointly and severally, but collection from one shall relieve the other. All uncollected fees due the City shall constitute a continuing lien against the property served to the same extent, and subject to the same addition of interest and costs, as provided by law with respect to ad valorem taxes, and may be enforced and collected in the same manner provided for the collection of delinquent taxes, including, but not limited to, the filing of record of a lien against the property in the Henry County Superior Court Clerk's Office.

(f) It shall be the duty of the Henry County Tax Commissioner to collect the amount of the lien imposed under Subsection (a) as if it were a real property ad valorem tax, using all methods available for collecting real property ad valorem tax, including specifically Chapter 4 of Title 48 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.); provided, however, that the limitation of O.C.G.A. § 48-4-73 which requires twelve (12) months of delinquency before commencing a tax foreclosure shall not apply.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State of Georgia.

SECTION 3.

(A) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are and were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

(B) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council

that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.


(C) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

SECTION 4. Repeal of Conflicting Provision. Except as otherwise provided herein, all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


SECTION 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after its adoption by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hampton.
