

**ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE
OF HAMPTON, GEORGIA, TO ADD A NUMBERING PROVISION
FOR EACH BUILDING IN HAMPTON**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Hampton, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by authority of same:

GENERAL

NUMBERING OF BUILDINGS - ASSIGNMENT.

Street numbers for dwelling units and places of business on all public streets and street numbers and/or building numbers for dwelling units and places of business within apartment projects and nonresidential developments located on private streets shall be assigned by the Building Department in accordance with administrative procedures.

POSTING.

Each dwelling unit and place of business shall have light reflective numbers posted and maintained in a prominent place on the property, visible from the street providing public access, the address of the dwelling unit or place of business:

- (1) For residences using mailboxes: Two (2) inch high light reflective numbers with contrasting background;
- (2) For residences which do not use mailboxes and within 100 feet of roadway: Three (3) inch high light reflective numbers with contrasting background;
- (3) For residences which do not use mailboxes and are more than 100 feet from roadway: Three (3) inch high light reflective numbers visible from the roadway with contrasting background; and
- (4) For all commercial establishments: Three (3) inch high light reflective numbers with contrasting backgrounds.

PENALTIES.

Any person violating the terms of this ordinance or rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto shall be punished in Recorders Court for the City of Hampton by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$500.00) and/or sixty (60) days in jail for each separate violation. Each day the violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

BE IT ORDAINED, that all resolutions, ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

BE IT ORDAINED, that the Mayor of the City of Hampton be authorized to sign this ordinance on behalf of the City of Hampton.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall become effective upon signature by the Mayor of the City of Hampton.
