**ORDINANCE NO. 64**

**AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AN AGENDA  
TO BE FOLLOWED IN MEETINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL  
OF THE CITY OF HAMPTON, GEORGIA**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Hampton, Georgia, recognize that it is in the public interest that the City of Hampton establish an agenda to be followed in meetings of the City Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HAMPTON, GEORGIA, AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the City Clerk shall print an agenda for each council meeting. The agenda will be completed and placed in the City Council members' box by no later than noon on the Friday preceding the next Council meeting.
2. That if any member of the City Council desires that a matter be heard, discussed or ruled upon by the Mayor and Council, the Council person must notify the Clerk either, orally or in writing, to place the matter on the agenda. Such notices must be given prior to 5:00 p.m. on the Wednesday, preceding the next Council meeting.
3. That if the public desires that a matter be heard, discussed or ruled upon by the Mayor and Council, they must notify the Clerk either orally or in writing, to place the matter on the agenda. Such notices must be given prior to 5:00 p.m. on the Wednesday, preceding the next Council meeting.
4. That all matters placed upon the agenda will be heard and discussed. However, the Mayor and Council will not be required to rule on any manner unless they deem it to be appropriate.
5. That the agenda may be amended and an item added thereto by the approval of the majority of the Mayor and Council voting on a resolution to amend the agenda.
6. That this Ordinance shall become effective upon the passage of the Ordinance on the second and final reading.
7. That any Ordinance that is in conflict herewith is hereby specifically repealed.

8. That the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are severable; and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, that unconstitutionality sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the Mayor and Council without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.
