Present: Mayor Coley, Councilpersons Mitcham, Byrd, Lowe, Hutchison and Meeks. Councilperson Hearn and City Manager Andy Pippin were not present. Also present City Attorney Scott Mayfield, City Clerk Kim Drinkall, Chief of Police Rad Porter, and Public Works Director John Spraggins.

Ms. Janet Schellnut Henry County Election Superintendent spoke with Mayor and Council about the upcoming election. She stated that Hampton is the only municipality that will be able to vote with the County and City on the same ballot. Voters in Hampton will not have to go to City and County precincts on Election Day as the other 3 cities will have to do. Election Day is November 8<sup>th</sup>, all city residents will vote at their County precinct, either North Hampton or South Hampton and receive a ballot with both County and City. Early voting with extended hours from 7:00 to 7:00 will begin on October 31<sup>st</sup> through November 4<sup>th</sup> at the Train Depot across from the Police station.

Councilperson Lowe made a motion, second by Councilperson Byrd, to make the corner of E. Main Street and Woodlawn Ave. a 4 way stop. The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

No action was taken on having the City Attorney amend Ordinance No.175 alcohol hours of sale.

After a brief discussion the Council decided to put speed bumps between Cunningham Ave. and West Main Street. The Council asked Public Works Director John Spraggins to do a cost analysis and bring it back to the Council at the next meeting.

Mayor and Council received no public comment on the Short Term Work Program 2011-2015 and Capitol Improvements Element Update.

Under Public Comment Mr. Rucker stated the Hampton Historic Commission would hold a Public Hearing on the 18<sup>th</sup> of October to consider the proposal for a Historic District known as Hampton Downtown East Main South Historic District. He stated the district would include 4 McDonough Street, 20, 27, 29, 32, 34, and 35 East Main Street South. He asked the Council to attend the public hearing. Mr. Rucker also informed the Mayor and Council that the Veterans Crosses would be going up the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> of November.

Councilperson Hutchison made a motion, second by Councilperson Lowe, to approve Resolution No. 11-11, a resolution to adopt the Short Term Work Program and Capitol Improvements Element Annual Update covering the five year period 2011-2015. The motion passed unanimously (5-0).

Councilperson Lowe made a motion, second by Councilperson Hutchison, to have the Mayor proclaim November as the National American Indian Heritage Month. The motion passed unanimously (5-0).
